

**92% of respondents said that they believe the government should make it easier to switch insurers if a health plan drops your doctor,** including 91% of Republican respondents, 93% of Democrat respondents, and 93% of unaffiliated respondents.

**92% of respondents agreed that the government should show what a fair price would be for specific procedures,** including 91% of Republican respondents, 94% of Democrat respondents, and 90% of unaffiliated respondents.

**91% of respondents said that they believe the government should require insurers to provide upfront cost estimates to consumers,** including 89% of Republican respondents, 93% of Democrat respondents, and 91% of unaffiliated respondents.

**88% of respondents said that they believe the government should set standard prices for prescription drugs to make them affordable,** including 81% of Republican respondents, 91% of Democrat respondents, and 89% of unaffiliated respondents.

**91% of respondents said that they believe the government should require hospitals and doctors to provide up-front cost estimates to consumers,** including 91% of Republican respondents, 92% of Democrat respondents, and 89% of unaffiliated respondents.
