

Federal Legislative Efforts

- Senate bill (S. 1804) was introduced by Sen. Bernie Sanders with 16 original co-sponsors
 - Extensive news coverage and social media attention in the lead up and after the Sept. 13, 2017 release
- House bill (H.R. 676) introduced by Rep. John Conyers and currently has 120 co-sponsors – over 60 percent of the House Democratic Caucus






Arguments in Favor of Single Payer Plan Sway Some Initial Opponents


